## Explanation of Transcript and Class Rank

The class schedule consists of A day, B day and Virtual Day instructional periods per semester with a variety of scheduling flexibility.

Class rank is determined at the end of each semester and is a weighted scale. Students receive a .5 quality point for Honors and 1 quality point for AP and CCP courses. The grade in each class is converted to the 4.0 weighted scale, and each individual 4.0 conversion is averaged together to determine GPA and class rank.

## Graduation Requirements

22 credits are required for graduation. A student must successfully complete the following course requirements as well as the specific elective requirements for their chosen Course of Study.
