East Rowan High School is one of seven public four year high schools in the Rowan-Salisbury School System and is accredited by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Explanation of Transcript and Class Rank

Class rank is determined at the end of each semester and is a weighted scale. Students receive a .5 quality point for Honors and 1 quality point for AP and CCP courses. The grade in each class is converted to the 4.0 weighted scale, and each individual 4.0 conversion is averaged together to determine GPA and class rank.
